Electives are offered at Soroka University Medical Center in Beer Sheva, which is affiliated with Ben-Gurion University of the Negev. Clinical electives afford exposure to Israel's diverse communities including native-born Israelis, Russian immigrants, Ethiopian, Yemenis, and Moroccan immigrants, and indigenous Bedouin.

For most clinical rotations, knowledge of spoken Hebrew is preferred and knowledge of Russian and/or Arabic are also helpful.

Hebrew is not required for research and electives in Epidemiology, Sociology of Health, Health Economics, Health Policy, Industrial Medicine. Housing can be arranged.
